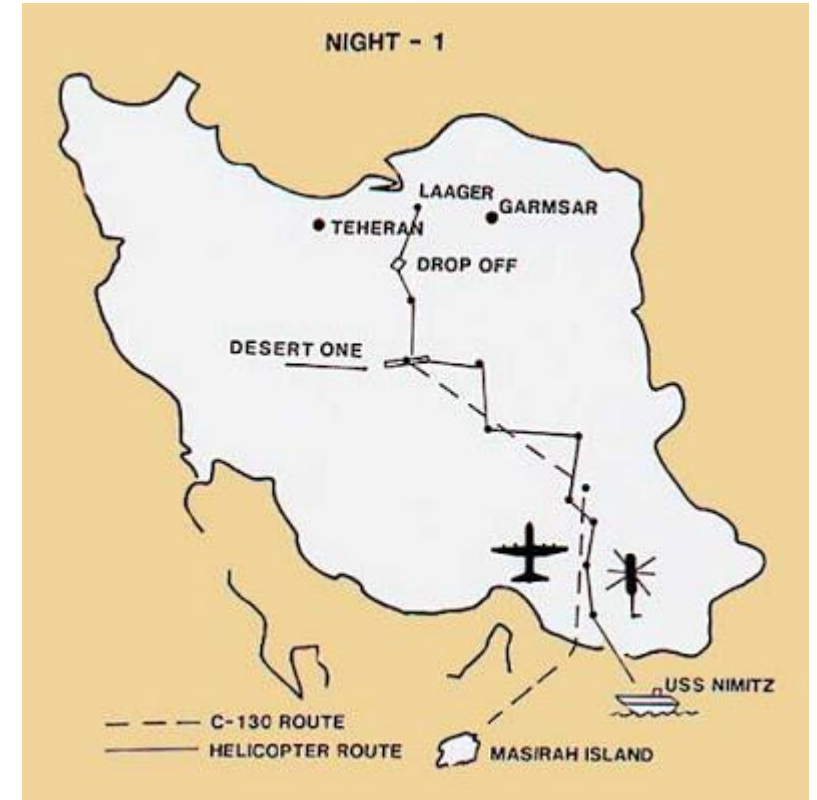

History

The Special Operations Warrior Foundation was founded in 1980 following a hostage rescue attempt in Iran.



Mission

The mission of the Special Operations Warrior Foundation is two-fold:

- Ensuring full financial grants for a post-secondary degree from college, university, technical or trade school for the surviving children of Special Operations personnel who are killed in the line of duty, and
- Providing immediate financial stipends to severely wounded and hospitalized Special Operations personnel.



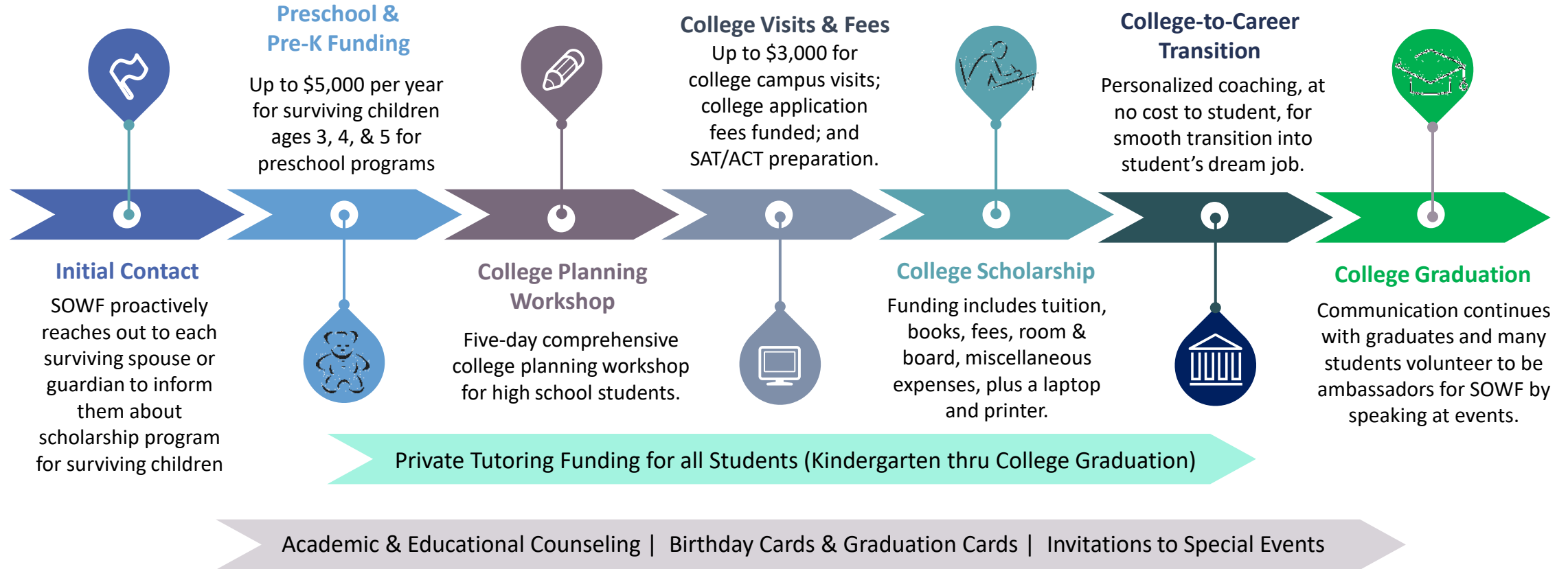
Special Operations Forces

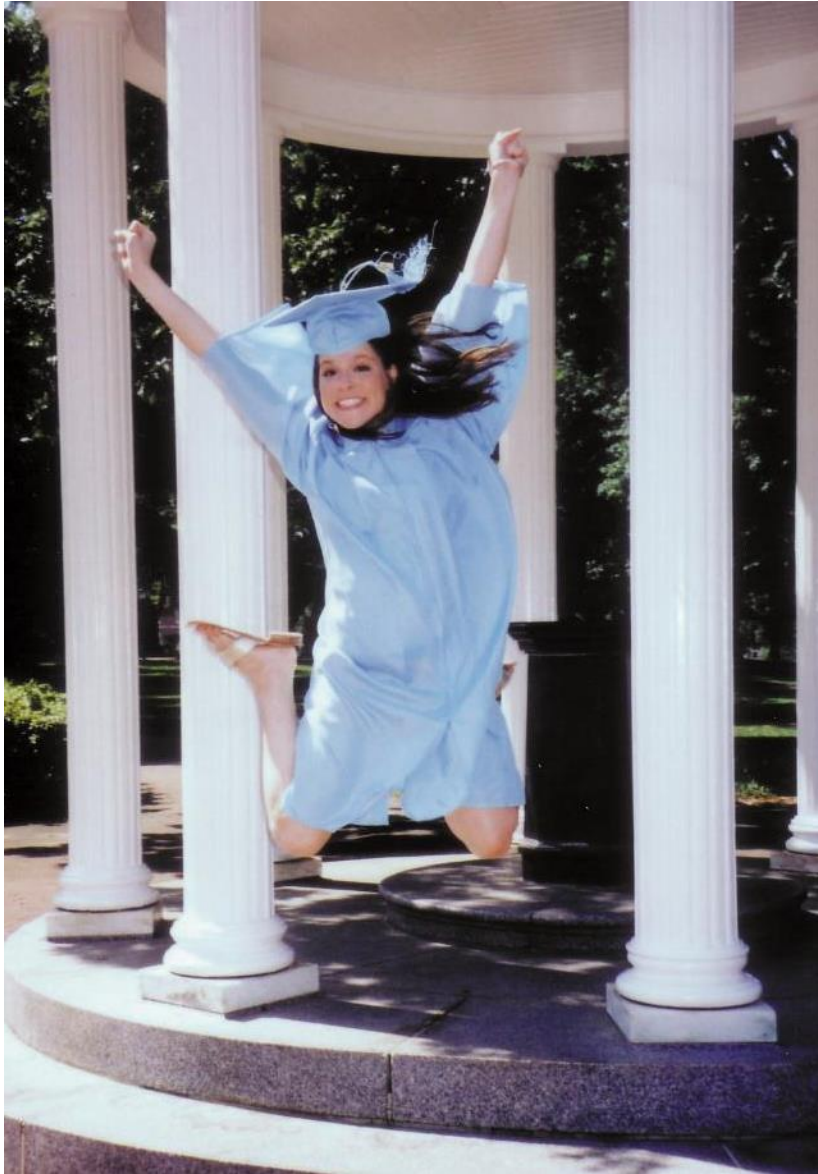
College Planning Conference
